Drop it off at the Transfer Station on the 30th <u>Can't make the 30th?</u> Fill out your own Datasheet and submit it before 9/30 at the bin outside the Town Office

Who can take part?: Anyone is welcome!

How to Participate:

1) Pick up trash along Georgetown's coast.



2) Record information about the trash – either on your own anytime during the month or bring the trash to the Transfer Station on the 30th for sorting, weighing, and data recording.

<u>If you do your own recording</u>: Use a Datasheet to record the items of trash you pick up, the weight of the trash, the participants, and the location. Drop the Datasheet off at the town office bin anytime in September or bring it to the Transfer Station on the 30th. If you can, separate the recyclables and returnables from the trash when disposing of it. Or bring it by the Transfer Station on the 30th for help!

If you bring the trash to the Transfer Station for recording on 9/30: Come by the Transfer Station anytime between 9:30 and 12:30, and volunteers will be on-hand to help with weighing, sorting, and inventorying the trash.

3) Win prizes! There will be gift card prizes for the heaviest trash and most interesting items found.



The pantry will be held at the Community Center and open the last Monday (usually!) of the month, from 3 PM til 5 PM.






