#### Report on the Selectboard Meeting of November 20, 2023

<u>The Meeting</u>: The meeting was conducted as a Zoom hybrid. Selectboard Member Jon Collins, Town Administrator Tyler Washburn, and Finance Director Mary McDonald were together in the Town Office. Selectboard Members Bronwen Tudor and Rich Donaldson were on Zoom. There were 12, members of the public in attendance on Zoom.

The minutes of the meeting of October 24, 2023 were approved. They will be posted on the Town website.

<u>Most Important/Interesting Items</u>: In my judgment, the following items were the most important things covered during the meeting.

- This meeting was rescheduled from 11/14 when the meeting was disrupted by a power and internet outage shortly after the meeting began
- Bill Van Tuinen, Assessing Agent, provided an update to the Board at 7:15pm regarding the proposed paper valuation. He explained what the coefficient of dispersion is and why the diversity of properties in Georgetown makes it difficult to reach the goal of 20 in the current valuation, the proposed paper valuation, or a full reevaluation. *Recordings of Selectboard meetings are available on the Town's YouTube channel: https://www.youtube.com/@GeorgetownME*
- After much discussion the Selectboard (SB) approved a motion to keep the current property valuation and include a note with the property tax bills explaining that the valuation will be adjusted in 2024. The SB will set the mil rate at the 11/28 meeting. The SB understands this is a very complex subject and intends to hold an informational session in the new year. It was mentioned several times that at Town Meeting the citizens approved a 2023-2024 Town Budget that increased after many years of a flat budget. Property taxes will show an increase this year to cover the approved budget whether using the current property valuation or if the paper valuation had been used
- Ole Jaeger has stepped down as the chair of the Board of Appeals. Aria Eee will take over as chair. The Selectboard expressed their gratitude to Ole for his years of service

#### **Public Comment:**

- Pamela Gunnell expressed concern about the fairness of Georgetown's property valuation. Her comment was well researched and complex. - Alison Freeman spoke regarding an incident that occurred at the Transfer Station (TS) in October. She referenced a letter the Solid Waste Committee (SWC) sent to the Selectboard (SB) to express their dismay that the SB did not show more support for the staff at the TS in a letter the SB sent to the citizens involved in the incident. Alison said "If we allow angry, aggressive behavior to stand without reprisal it will become the norm. Let us instead nurture the kindness and respect shown by the TS staff in an effort to resolve the situation when it began." (the SWC's letter will be included in the minutes from this meeting when they are approved and posted)
- Aria Eee thanked Sharon & Bob Trabona for the gift of a Christmas tree for the 12/16 harbor event
- Bob Trabona expressed gratitude for Ole Jaeger's years of service to the Town. He also expressed concern that the Selectboard's decision to hold off on revaluation would result in a reduction in homestead and veteran's exemptions in a year when taxes will increase because of the increase in the Town's budget
- Chris Martin thanked the Selectboard for their due diligence on the property tax valuation issue


