THE MEETING: There were two members of the public present. The minutes of the meeting of February 27 were approved.

MOST IMPORTANT/INTERESTING ITEMS: There were none. It was a dull meeting and over by 7:40 PM.

CORRESPONDENCE:

In Mary's absence (see below), Geoff Birdsall reported on correspondence received. There was no listing in the meeting agenda.

One item was a projection of the enrollments for next year: pre-K through 6th = 77 7th through 12th = 42.

OLD BUSINESS:

Bill Plummer reported on the status of a spill of heating oil at a private residence in Five Islands. He said that the Maine DEP had determined that there was no contamination of the nearby Town well, but that three private wells were contaminated and were being cleaned.

A representative of The Department of Environmental Protection and the Lincoln County Supervisor visited the Transfer Station. They reported that the Universal Hazardous Waste Building had way too much unrelated materials stored there. The Selectmen agreed to ask the Solid Waste Committee to meet with the Board at the next Board meeting to discuss remedies.

The deficiencies at the Transfer Station noted during the Department of Labor inspection have all been fixed. Some of the deficiencies regarding documentation of training of Fire Department personnel have not been dealt with. Bill Plummer will take this up with the Fire Chief in the next couple of days.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

The annual Get to Know Your Neighbors party will be at the Georgetown Community Center at 2 PM on Sunday, March 23.

Mary McDonald, Town Treasurer and Assistant to the Selectmen had heart surgery about two weeks ago. Apparently all went well and she is resting at home.
