## REPORT ON THE SELECTBOARD MEETING OF APRIL 11, 2017

THE MEETING: There were 2 members of the public present.

The minutes of the meeting of March 28, 2017 were approved. They will be posted on the Town website.

<u>MOST IMPORTANT/INTERESTING ITEMS</u>: In my judgment, the following items were the most important things covered during the meeting.

- Assessing Items: The Board discussed an abatement request for two adjacent properties that the resident wanted to be considered as one. They asked for a reduction in the land valuation and also reduction in the structures valuation since they had already demolished the house. There was a letter from the property owner's lawyer stating their case. The interesting part, to me, was that there are two separate procedures for combining lots depending on whether both equal/exceed 5 acres. Because they didn't in this case, the owner must register a deed combining the properties. Our Assessor, Bill VanTuinen provided a court case supporting the required deed. A separate issue was the date the house was demolished. After considerable discussion the Board agreed to reducing structure valuation but not land valuation.
- Open Space, Tree Growth, Veteran and Homestead Exemptions: Mary provided spreadsheets detailing each of these four categories of exemption that reduce property tax valuations. Georgetown has 1942 acres in Open Space and 277 acres in Tree Growth. There are 51 properties with Veteran's exemptions. All of these are the same as last year. But there has been a net increase of 10 Homestead exemptions.
- **Sagadahoc Budget:** The proposed county budget includes \$865,799 from Georgetown. This amount is down \$23,968 from last year.

- Boards and Committees: The Board approved Jim Peavy as a full member of the Shellfish Conservation Committee.
- (proposed) Volunteer Fair: The Board confirmed they want to have such a "fair" but haven't yet reached agreement on when/how it will be accomplished. They reviewed a one sheet flyer, from Waterville, for a similar event/process and agreed this was a good concept.
