### **REPORT ON THE SELECTBOARD MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 27, 2016**

THE MEETING: There were 3 members of the public present.

The minutes of the meetings of September 13 and 16 (executive session only), 2016 were approved. They have been posted on the Town website.

<u>MOST IMPORTANT/INTERESTING ITEMS</u>: In my judgment, the following items were the most important things covered during the meeting.

- **Comprehensive Plan:** At the end of the meeting four members of an ad-hoc committee came to discuss/recommend that the Selectboard establish and authorize a committee to look into updating the Town Comprehensive Plan which was last updated in 1993. This was a follow-up to discussion at the previous Selectboard meeting (see minutes). There was considerable discussion about the **content** of a comprehensive plan (which is defined by the State), the benefits of having a comprehensive plan (fundamentally so the town can apply for grants), the amount of work involved in creating a comprehensive plan and negative reaction/comment from the previous comprehensive plan. MacKay indicated she was prepared to go ahead but Ms. Pinette and Mr. Birdsall both expressed concern. They agreed that the Selectboard would make a decision by the end of October.
- Assessing Items: Mary advised that field work was complete and Mr. VanTuinen is reviewing the data. All updates to be complete by October 15th to support issue of property tax bills.

# CORRESPONDENCE:

- First Church: MacKay indicated that the citizens group had identified a structural engineer from Brunswick who was willing to come to review structural aspects of the building at no cost to the Town. After a brief discussion, it was agreed to proceed with this review on October 5th.
- **Committee/Board Appointments:** Mary noted that she will post a list of openings around town and in the Tide. Anyone interested in one or more of these positions should contact Mary or one of the Selectmen.
- **Tree Cutting Violation:** Certified letters have gone to the owner, her attorney and the contractor. Birdsall provided a quick status update. The owner has contracted with a forester to develop the revegetation plan and with another company to clean up the trees that were felled. The original contractor has not yet accepted responsibility.
